State implements PACE funding

Michigan Agency for Energy is the first state energy agency in the U.S. to implement PACE funding for energy efficiency and renewable energy initiatives. To celebrate project completion, MAE/MPSE hosted an open house October 2 at their facility located at 7109 W. Saginaw Highway, Lansing, MI. The celebration was in honor of the project completion which is expected to save more than \$25,000 annually in energy costs.

Grand Rapids completes phase one construction for ESPC project

The City of Grand Rapids has completed the first phase of an ESPC at its Waste Water Treatment Facility. The project will save \$2.2 million in energy costs over the next 15 years. It also is contributing to broader City sustainability targets like reducing carbon emissions by 10,000 metric tons and increasing energy efficiency and conservation at City facilities by 10%
